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SPEAKER BIOS

Raymond Y.W. Chinn, MD is Medical Director of the Infection Prevention Program and advisor to the Antimicrobial Stewardship Program at the Sharp Metropolitan Medical Campus in San Diego. He is a Fellow of the Infectious Disease Society of America, and the Society of Healthcare Epidemiology of America. His clinical interests include prevention of healthcare-associated infections, HIV medicine and management of infectious complications of solid organ transplants. Dr. Chinn is a graduate of the University of Texas Medical School at Houston.

Jackie Hopkins, MPH has over 20 years of experience as an epidemiologist with the Epidemiology Program in the County of San Diego Health and Human Services Agency. She coordinates communicable disease outbreak response for the Epidemiology Program, including response to influenza, norovirus, and foodborne disease outbreaks. She develops outbreak investigation guidelines and tools, trains new staff, and provides subject-matter expertise to long-term care and other congregate living facilities regarding management of outbreaks based on state and national guidance.

Jeff Johnson, MPH is the Chief of the Epidemiology and Immunization Services Branch, Public Health Services at the County of San Diego Health and Human Services Agency. He has been working in public health for over 20 years. He directs a team of staff responsible for public health surveillance, biosurveillance and public health informatics including: oversight of the communicable disease - surveillance registry, influenza surveillance, electronic lab reporting, syndromic surveillance, meaningful use and strategic planning.

Eric McDonald, MD, MPH is the Medical Director for the Epidemiology and Immunization Services Branch, Public Health Services at the County of San Diego Health and Human Services Agency. He is also the current Chairman of the San Diego BioWatch Advisory Committee and Adjunct Clinical Instructor at the Department of Military and Emergency Medicine, Uniformed Services University of the Health Sciences in Bethesda, MD. He is a Voluntary Assistant Clinical Professor at the Department of Family Medicine and Public Health at UCSD.

Mark Sawyer, MD is the Medical Director of the UCSD San Diego Immunization Partnership, a contract with the County of San Diego Health and Human Services to improve immunization delivery in San Diego. He is also a Professor of Clinical Pediatrics and a Pediatric Infectious Disease specialist at the UCSD School of Medicine and Rady Children's Hospital San Diego. He is a past member of the federal Centers for Disease Control's Advisory Committee for Immunization Practices and current member of the American Academy of Pediatrics Committee on Infectious Disease. He has participated for several years on the California Immunization Committee, an advisory committee to the California State Immunization Branch. Dr. Sawyer is a fellow of the American Academy of Pediatrics and belongs to numerous professional societies including the Society of Pediatric Research, the Infectious Disease Society of America and the Pediatric Infectious Diseases Society.
